

# COMMERCIAL DRIVER TRAINING, BASIC CERTIFICATE

The Commercial Driver Training certificate program is designed for individuals with little or no commercial driving experience. The Commercial Driver Training program trains students for entry level employment as commercial motor vehicle operators. In partnership with the Illinois Department of Transportation, this program prepares students to obtain a Commercial Driver's License (CDL) in the State of Illinois.

- Must be at least 21 years of age
- Have a valid Illinois driver's license
- Have a good driving record
- Provide a current Court-Purpose Motor Vehicle Report (MVR) which can be obtained from Secretary of State for \$12.00
- Be able to pass a DOT Physical and Drug Screen
- Must be able to read, write and understand English
